2. Measures taken to complete the syllabus of courses and programs.

The faculty members of our institution used various ICT enabled tools to enhance the quality of teaching-learning in the academic year 2020-21 which are as follows:
 Google Classroom was used to manage and post course related learning materials, e-notes, reference materials etc. This platform was also utilised for Online Evaluation, Assignments, Multiple Choice Questions, Quiz assignments and Tests at regular intervals to measure learning outcomes. Curriculum based online quizzes and polls were regularly conducted to enhance the quality of teaching in the institution.
 The PPTs were enabled with animations and simulations to improve the effectiveness of the teaching- learning process. The online learning platforms were designed to train students to engage in open discussion and problem-solving activities. Learner-centred teaching-learning activities were conducted in such a way that online time could be used innovatively and productively to make the sessions more effective and interesting.
 Audio-Visual (AV) Room facility was used to conduct video lectures and upload the content in appropriate virtual platforms for students' access. Online flipped classes helped students watch short lecture videos and complete activities such as group discussion, team work, projects or other exercises online.
 Virtual labs were also used to conduct experiments through simulations. Lab manuals were mailed to students well in advance before the experiment was performed. Whiteboard and Jam board in Google meet were used to teach Mathematics and Statistics effectively. Internet based projects (search & learn) were in place to promote self-learning. Project Based Learning (PBL) was aimed integrating multiple peer groups for the project and generating ideas collaboratively.
 Brainstorming exercises always helped the learners think spontaneously, derive solutions and appreciate others' views. It develops a sense of responsibility to think and learn themselves. Case studies with thought provoking questions, exercises can be shared with them in Google classroom or through email. Case study is one of the best exercises for learners to apply their understanding of the topic.
 Cooperative Learning Strategies were also implemented through online Trivariate Mentoring system which consists of Mentor Mentee Mode (MMM), Mentoring through Peer Groups (MPG) and Vertical mentoring (VM). In addition to the aforementioned initiatives, webinars, seminars and workshops were also conducted to make the online learning and interaction effective.
 ?ICT Tools and Infrastructure facilities:
 This includes:
 Projectors, Desktop and Laptops, Printers, Photocopier machines and Scanners are commonly used for online teaching learning process. Auditorium, conclaves with smart board and smart classrooms are additional infrastructure facilities available for smooth conduction of curriculum delivery through online platforms. Library provides Digital Repositories called DSPACE and Lib SPACE for Online access of E-Books, E-Journals, notes, handouts and PPTs for students. Online classes are conducted through Google Meet and Zoom and study materials, assignments and tasks are assigned through Google Classroom.
 ?Use of ICT By Faculty:
 Power Point Presentations, Industry- Academia Interface, Online Quiz, Video Conferencing, Video lectures, Online competitions, Workshops, Conferences, Student Seminars, Online Examinations, Orientation programmes, Faculty Development Programmes, Refresher Courses and Faculty Exchange Programmes are also conducted online using ICT.
